On April 30, 2017, 12 selected Candidates competed in the 2017 Connecticut State National Nominations Candidates Tournament, hosted by the University of New Haven.

Four Candidates were selected in each National Invitational Tournament Category via the Connecticut National Nominations Grand Prix competition and the 2016-17 State Championship tournaments to compete in this Candidates' Tournament.

The Candidates' Tournament is a three round competition with Game 60 delay 10 time controls, with all Candidates having an opportunity to play one another.
