Retains Championship

The New Britain Round Robin Chess Championship for 1966 has been won by Arkadijs Strazdins, a veteran chess expert and an employee of the Stanley Works, with a score of 23 wins and one draw.

After a brilliant play, Steven Astoria held the champion to his only draw.

Strazdins won the title for the first time in 1952 and has retained it every year since.

Jan Laska and Alojzy Szupak tied for second and third with 18 points each. Jan Cendrowski, tournament director, and president, was fourth with 17 points, and Zdzislaw Jankowski was fifth.

Steven Astoria, Edward Nowakowski and Roman Kolodziej tied for sixth, seventh and eighth. Stanley Liaukmslinas was ninth, Chest Sawicki 10th, Edward Pelec 11th and Roman M. Kolodziej 12th. The local club is open to all players Wednesday nights at Gen. Haller Post.

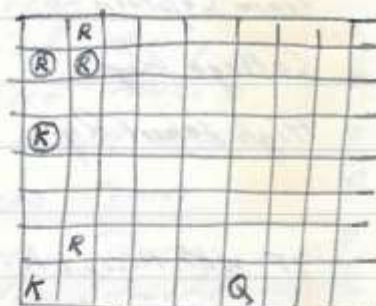

Prominent War Veteran Stricken

Jan P. Cendrowski, 62, of 15 Richmond Ave., prominent in veterans affairs, was stricken at his home Saturday and was pronounced dead at New Britain General Hospital. Born in Poland, he came to New Britain 18 years ago.

He was a veteran of two armies during World War II. He was a member of the Polish Army and also fought with the British forces.

He was a former commander of General Haller Post, Polish World War Veterans, and a member of the Pulaski Democratic Club, Falcons Nest 88 and the Holy Cross Church. Mr. Cendrowski was president of the New Britain and General Haller Post Chess Club. He was employed at the Fafnir Bearing Co. for 17 years until last April.

He leaves a daughter, Mrs. Alicia Urbanowski, with whom he made his home; a sister, Mrs. Janina Kobiela of New Britain, and a grandson.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 8:15 a.m. at the New Britain Memorial Funeral Home and at 9 at Holy Cross Church. Burial with military honors will be in Sacred Heart Cemetery.
